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HISTORY



In **1857**, Miss Ernestine Nardin founded Nardin Academy in Buffalo, New York. Miss Nardin and her fellow members of the *Daughters of the Heart of Mary* (DHM) were charged with educating the children of the Catholic diocese, particularly girls, in a faith-based community. The DHM continues to play an integral role within Nardin Academy as current board members and former administrators and faculty members.

NARDIN ACADEMY



Located in the heart of Buffalo's Elmwood Village, Nardin Academy educates children from 18 months to 12th grade. Our core values are implemented into lessons taught in our Montessori program, through elementary, and throughout high school. This continuity of education nurtures a child to accept and believe these values as his or her own.



Montessori (18 months-3rd Grade, coed)

In our Montessori Toddler, Early Childhood and 1st through 3rd grade classes, students learn to work together, allowing for interaction, leadership, and learning between age groups. This program has been developed in accordance to the education system created by Maria Montessori in Italy and is the only program in the region accredited by the American Montessori Society.



Lower School (K-4, coed)

Nardin students are challenged through a well-rounded approach of skills, practice, service, and experiential learning. In addition to academics, we care about our students' social-emotional health. Our teachers spend time with each class learning about kindness, team building, friendship, digital citizenship, and mindfulness.



Middle School (5-8, coed)

Nardin middle school students learn in flexible classrooms designed to allow for movement and collaboration, project-based work, creativity, and innovation. Our advanced academics within this environment help prepare our students for the rigors of high school. A wide variety of sports (including swimming, squash, lacrosse, and softball) and clubs (such as drama, robotics, recycling, and ski club) keep our students engaged and learning outside the classroom.



High School (9-12, all-girls)

As the oldest independent, Catholic all-girls school in Western New York, we are committed to the highest standards of excellence in academics, athletics, the arts, and service. Our young women receive a premier education that prepares them for college and beyond.

While Nardin continues to model our learning and interaction after these core, traditional values, we strive to implement an environment that best reflects modern learning. Nardin Academy High School has moved away from the New York State Regents examinations. As an independent school, we have the freedom to use a variety of teaching methods, project-based learning, and assessment tools. We continue to use our AP, PSAT, SAT, and ACT exam results as a standardized measure of our academic excellence. This change furthers our standard of academic excellence and increases the recognition by higher education admissions of our students' achievements.

Nardin has implemented an improved schedule. Students attend 55-minute periods rather than traditional 42-minute periods.

DISTANCE LEARNING

Nardin Academy is committed to providing the highest standards in academics for all our students even when our faculty teach remotely. In March, we transitioned seamlessly to our Distance Learning program when New York State mandated the closure of schools.

- Students continue to follow their daily 8:00 am 3:00 pm class schedules, including core subjects, Physical Education, Art and Music.
- Faculty livestream classes and offer office hours for extra help.
- Each student has her own Chromebook, allowing for uninterrupted learning.
- Guidance counselors and our psychologist provide extra support.





ADVISORY
